

**ORDER DENYING STATE'S MOTION TO ADVISE
DEFENDANTS OF EFFECTS OF SPEEDY TRIAL DEMAND**

On August 30, 2023, the State filed a motion outlining various appellate decisions that explore how a statutory demand for speedy trial affects the standard discovery deadlines and notice of trial. (Doc. 22). Many of the deadlines highlighted within those cases, if imposed, would directly conflict with this Court's Standing Case Management Order and its routinely entered case specific scheduling order. *See* Amended Standing Case Management Order for Criminal Cases in Judge Scott McAfee's Division, 2023-EX-000227 (Aug. 24, 2023).¹ The State and each Defendant are subject to this Order and the case specific scheduling order (which the Court intends to have issued for all Defendants soon after arraignment and after considering any severance motions). Should this caselaw become relevant to a particular Defendant, the State is welcome to raise it at that time. The motion is **DENIED**.
